McAllister is a board certified medical entomologist. She received a PhD from the University of Arkansas. After doing postdoctoral work at Louisiana State University and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control in Atlanta, she worked for five years at the New Orleans Mosquito Termite and Rodent Control Board. She currently works at the CDC in Ft. Collins, Colorado, where she participates in emergency response activities and conducts research on insecticide resistance and vector control. McAllister is an adjunct professor at Tulane University in New Orleans, and faculty affiliate at Colorado State University in Ft. Collins. She is a past president of the American Mosquito Control Association, West Central Mosquito and Vector Control Association and Louisiana Mosquito Control Association. Currently, McAllister is the contiguous United States, or CONUS, vector control team lead for Zika virus at CDC.
